

Clinical Advisor (Mental Health Programme)

Mind HK is a fast-paced, quickly-growing mental health charity, with the mission to ensure that no one in Hong Kong is facing a mental health problem alone. Since our launch in November 2017, we have trained over 12,000 people on mental health awareness, have an average of 50,000 users per month on our website, and regularly engage with hundreds of thousands of individuals from the local community through our campaigns.

Mind HK is currently looking for a Clinical Advisor with extensive experience in IAPT or primary care mental health settings with knowledge of Acceptance and Commitment Therapy (ACT). The role will oversee and manage the clinical aspects of the Psychological Wellbeing Practitioner (PWP) pilot programme development and rollout, including service development and adaptation of the trainee and supervisor training.

They will advise on the design, development and implementation of the programme alongside key partners (overseas and local). The successful candidate will work closely with the project coordinator and service delivery coordinator to ensure the suitability, compliance, and delivery of the PWP programme and pilot. They will work with local and international university partners to develop content and finalise accreditation arrangements.

Requirements

Essential:

- Clinical qualification (e.g. DClinPsy, Masters in Counselling)
- Experience in service development projects
- Experience working in IAPT or other primary care mental health services
- Experience in adult mental health services (ages 18 and above)
- Some knowledge of ACT

Desirable

- At least 3 years post-qualification work experience
- Proof of training in CBT
- Proof of training in ACT
- Clinical experience using ACT to treat mental health problems
- Bilingual (English and Cantonese)

Terms:

Part-time (2 days per week); salary - negotiable; 2 year contract, renewal subject to review at contract end.
